**Signs of poisoning can be any combination of vomiting, respiratory distress, weakness, coordination difficulty, diarrhea, pupil dilation, twitching or shaking.**

## Other Poisons

- Chocolate (usually only in large quantities)
- Grapes and Raisins
  
- Aspirin, Ibuprofen, Phenylbutazone, Naproxen (non-steroidal anti-inflammatory pain relievers) if overdosed; follow veterinary instructions before using
- Tylenol
  
- Cocoa Mulch
- Household Cleaners (bleach, detergents, drain cleaners, pine oils)
- Lawn Chemicals and Pesticides
- Lead Poisoning
- Zinc Poisoning
